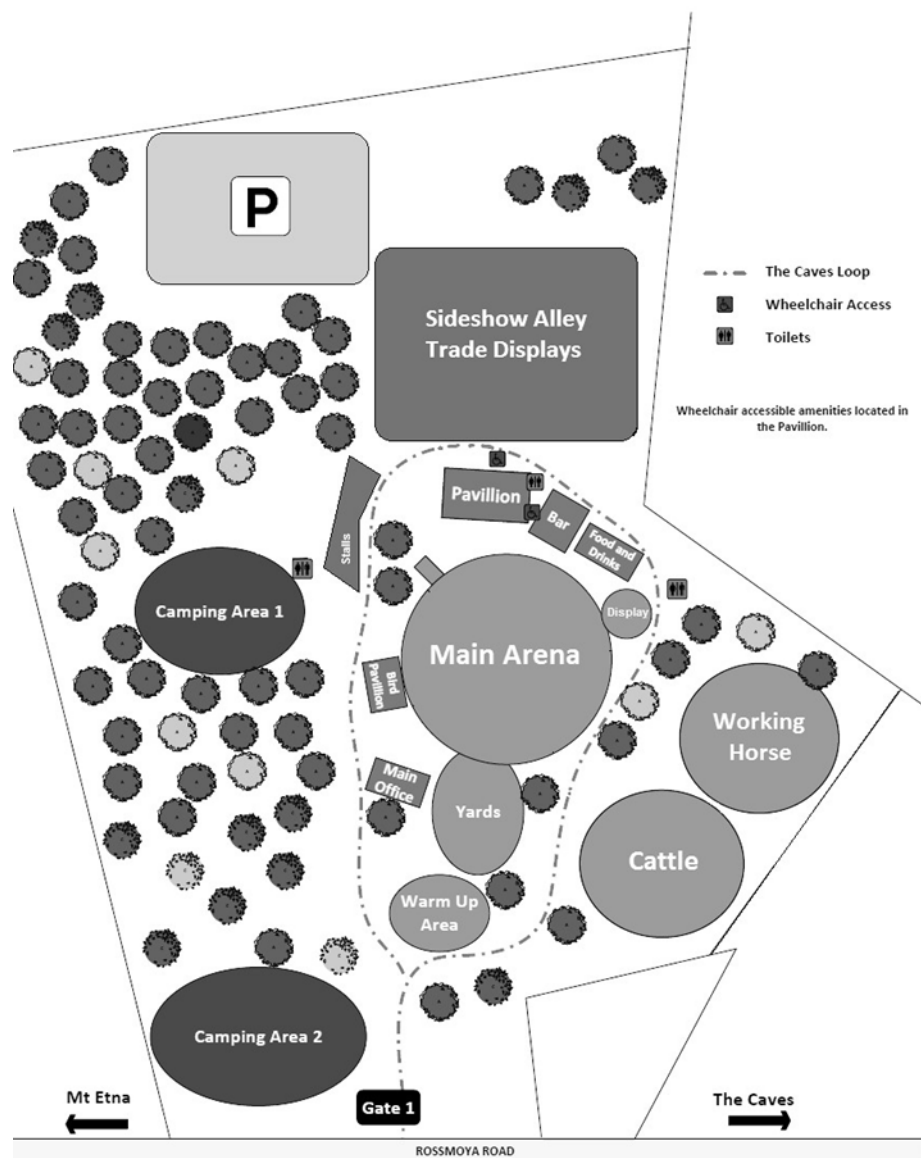

BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENTS

It is a condition of entry that exhibitors maintain good biosecurity practices whilst at the event and comply with the following requirements:

- All livestock must be in good health, eating normally and not shown signs of illness or disease, at least 3 days prior to and on arrival at The Caves Show.
- All livestock must arrive clean and free of organic material.
- All vehicles and equipment must arrive clean and free of organic material (e.g. excess manure and mud) that could contain disease or pests.
- Any signs of disease at the event must be reported to a steward, and if deemed necessary examined by the on-call veterinarian at the owners expense.
- In the event of a suspected livestock disease, exhibitors must follow any instructions given by a steward. If directed, livestock will be moved to an onsite quarantine facility for testing and/or treatment.
- In the event of any livestock movement restrictions, the exhibitor is responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of livestock including feeding and watering for the duration of the restriction.

MAIN ARENA EVENT RULES

By entering any event exhibitors and competitors agree to be bound by these rules:

- The Caves Progress & Agricultural Society Inc. (the Committee) reserves the right to:
 - refuse any entry.
 - disqualify and bar any competitor who breaches these rules and will require the return of any awards and prizes.
 - substitute prize money for an item of equal or greater value.
- The Committee's and/or Judge's decision is final.
- The Show is EA affiliated; the EA Nat. Show Horse Rules & Guidelines apply to all hack events.
- Classes may be varied at the Chief Steward's discretion.

ENTRIES & ELIGIBILITY

- Proof of age of junior competitors will be required. Please have valid proof of age available for rider classes (e.g. Student Card or copy of Birth Certificate).
- Proof of horses' height may be requested. Please have height certificates available. Horses may be measured for height at the Chief Stewards discretion.
- There will be no refund on entry fees for missed classes.
- A Maiden is a horse that has not won a first prize in a similar event at an affiliated show.
- A Novice is a horse that has not won a Championship at any Agricultural Show, or a Championship at an EA affiliated show or has not won a first at a Royal Show.
- Stallions are not permitted in ridden Hack classes.
- Stallions are eligible for all led classes, western and working horse classes.
- A Galloway Hack shall be over 14 hands and not exceed 15 hands.
- Horses competing in specific breed classes must be registered with their respective breed society and proof of registration and current membership must be produced on demand.
- No person under the age of 17 years is to handle a stallion.
- All riders must wear protective headgear to the current Australian Standard or better whilst riding anywhere on the showgrounds.
- The helmet retaining harness must be secured and fastened at all times that the rider is on the horse.
- All riders must wear suitable riding boots that are heeled and soled, with little or no tread, at all times when riding anywhere on the showgrounds.
- Electric fences are only allowed in designated areas and must be sign posted.

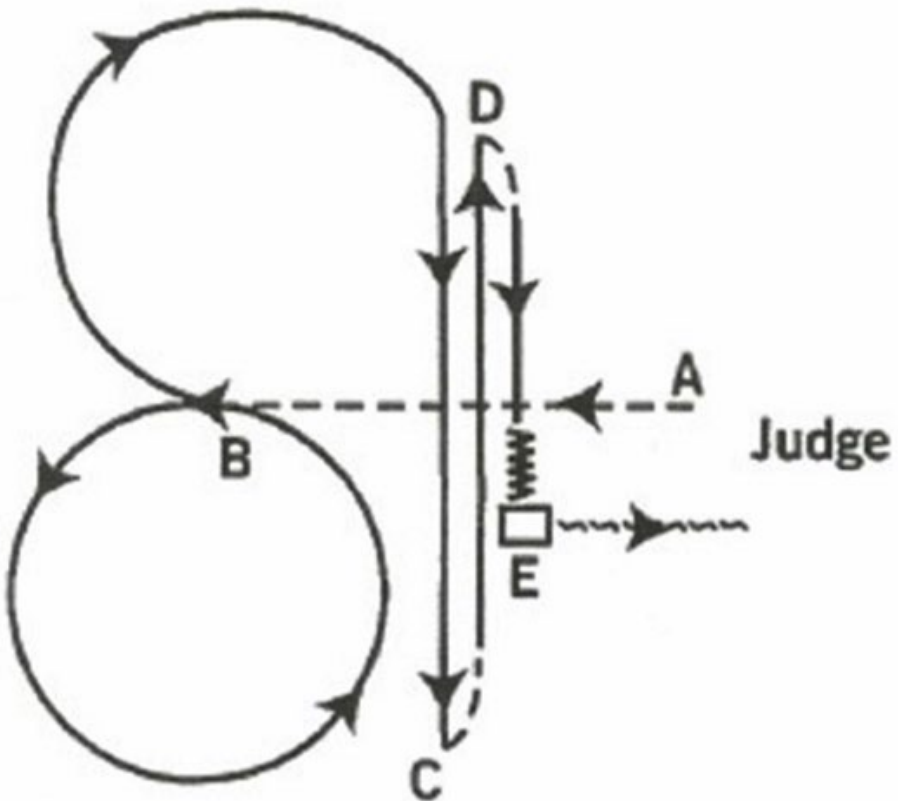
Notes:

WORKING STOCK HORSE PATTERN

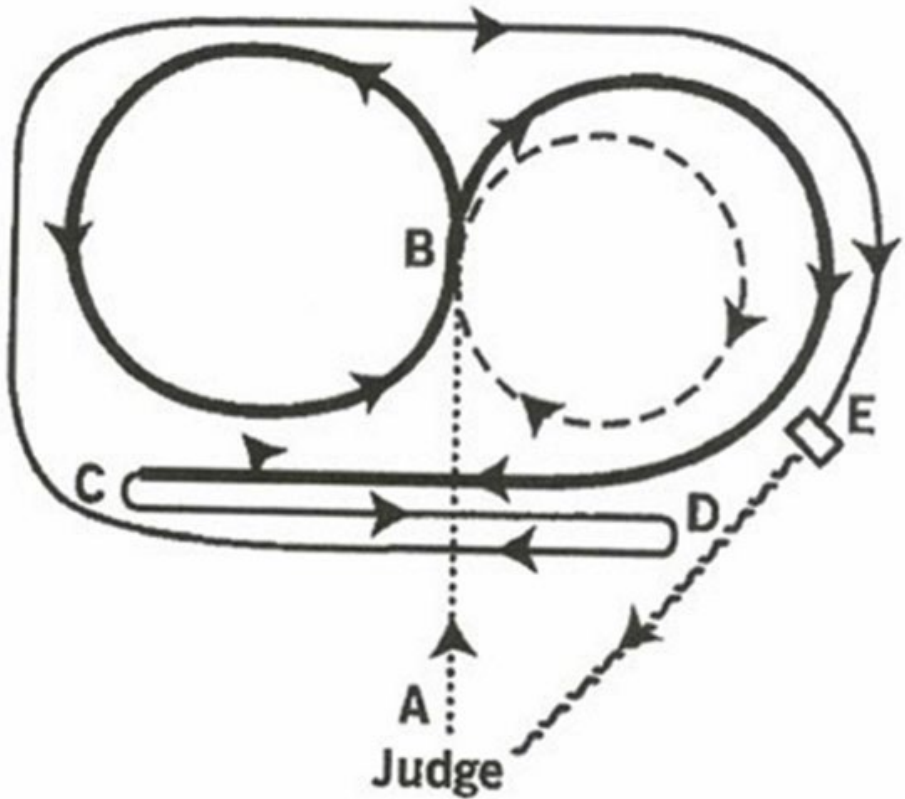
CHILD UNDER 12 YRS AND CHILD 12-17YRS



1. Trot from A with light rein contact
2. At B canter circle to left
3. Simple change at B, $\frac{3}{4}$ circle to right and continue straight onto C
4. At C stop and roll back to left
5. Canter straight to D and stop and roll back to right
6. Canter to E, stop settle and back up 4 paces
7. Walk to judge on loose rein

WORKING STOCK HORSE PATTERN

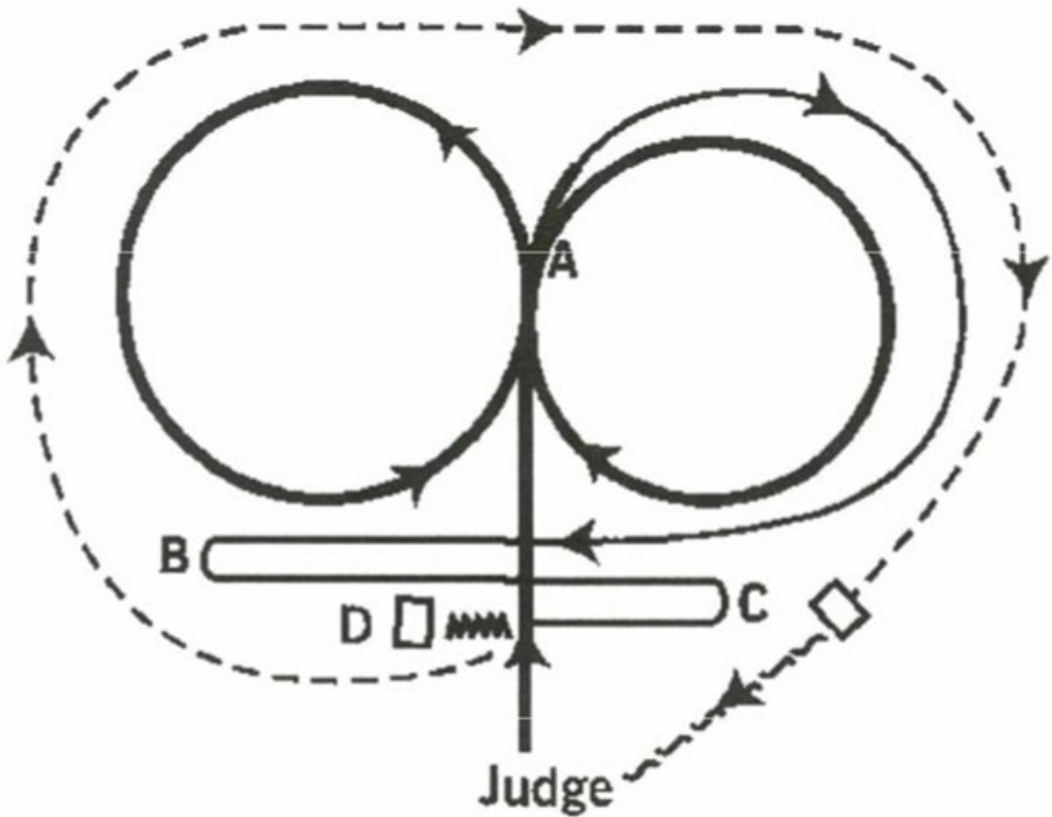
MAIDEN WORKING STOCK HORSE



1. From A walk to B and trot circle to right
2. At B hand gallop circle left
3. At B change leads and hand gallop right to C
4. At C stop, roll back left and canter to D
5. At D stop, roll back right
6. Continue at canter right round pattern to E
7. At E stop, settle and walk back to judge on loose rein

WORKING STOCK HORSE PATTERN

OPEN WORKING STOCK HORSE



1. From judge, hand gallop to A and circle right
2. At A, flying change lefthand gallop to circle to A
3. At A, flying change right, canter $\frac{3}{4}$ circle right, continue to B
4. At B, haunch turn left and canter to C
5. At C, haunch turn right and canter to D
6. At D stop, settle and back up 4 metres, settle
7. Trot right round work pattern to C
8. At C stop, walk back to judge on a loose rein

Stud Beef Cattle Rules:

1. Cattle age as at 1st April 2025.
2. Cattle over 12 months to wear a nose ring.
3. All cattle must be dehorned or poll.
4. The Committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes if necessary.
5. Exhibitors group-comprising three (3) head with both sexes to be represented & to have been exhibited in their respective classes by the same exhibitor.
6. Dam's progeny group – comprising of two (2) head from the same dam, with the same or different sexes exhibited by the same exhibitor and shown in their respective classes. The name of the dam is to be included with the nomination.
7. Sire's progeny group – comprising of three (3) head with both sexes to be represented by the same sire, exhibited by the same exhibitor and shown in their respective classes. The name of the sire is to be included with the nomination.

Biosecurity requirements:

- Cattle must be tagged with a NLIS device.
- NLIS scanning from 6am on show day.
- National Vendor Health Declarations must be handed in during NLIS scanning. Exhibitors are not required to hand in their movement record (NVD / Waybill).
- Johnes Beef Assurance Score – It is the exhibitor's responsibility to manage their herd's risk of Johnes Disease.
- All exhibitors must adhere to The Caves Show Biosecurity Requirements on Page 6 of the program.
